Privacy Policy

Skye and Lochalsh Council for Voluntary organisations are committed to protecting and respecting your privacy. This Policy explains how, when and why we collect personal information during the course of providing services to you and how we keep it secure.

- We only collect personal information about you where it is completely necessary or you have consented, and we ensure we only collect information we need.
- We will not send you direct marketing materials unless you have given us permission to do so.
- We will not sell or share your personal data with third parties.
- We will protect your personal information with appropriate combination of technical and organisation measures.

How do we collect information from you?

We collect information about you when you complete our Membership Application form, Mail list subscription form, Volunteer Application Form and during initial contact for support or other services provided by SLCVO. We need to collect this information from you to provide you services in relation to your membership, volunteer placement and direct support.

What type of information is collected from you?

The personal information we collect might include your name, address, email address, contact telephone number and details relevant to your volunteer registration. The processing of your information is under the legal basis of Contract, Legitimate Interests and where necessary Consent.

How is your information used?

We may use your information to:

- process your membership and carry out our obligations arising from your membership and Charity and Company regulations;
- deal with your enquiries and provide support;
- seek your views or comments on the services we provide;
- notify you of changes to our services;
- send you communications which you have requested and that may be of interest to you.
 These may include information about events, fundraising activities, promotions of our services;

We review our retention periods for personal information on a regular basis. We are legally required to hold some types of information to fulfil our statutory obligations. We will hold your personal information on our systems for as long as is necessary for the relevant activity, or as long as is set out in any relevant contract you hold with us.

Who has access to your information?

We will not sell or share your information to third parties.

We will not share your information with third parties for marketing purposes.

Milo Third Sector Database

Milo is the national database for third sector interfaces across Scotland. As a delivery agent of the Highland Third Sector Interface, Skye and Lochalsh CVO use the Milo database to manage and publish volunteering opportunities, record community group contact details and information about their activity, monitor the services we provide and contribute to national monitoring of the TSI network by the Scottish Government.

Only necessary Information provided by you will be entered onto Milo and used to monitor and improve the quality of our service, as well as to carry out local and national research on the third sector. If you do not wish for your personal information to be held on Milo please indicate on your form. Personal information held on Milo will not be disclosed to any unauthorised person or body without your permission.

Only authorised Milo users will have access to all of the information you supply. In the case of specific interactions with Skye and Lochalsh CVO staff, details will not be shared outside the Highland TSI.

General organisational information will be made available to other organisations and the public through approved local and national websites (such as www.volunteerscotland.org.uk). We will not display personal contact names or information unless you give us permission to do so.

Anonymised statistical data gathered from our database may be used to report to our various funders.

Your choices

You have a choice about whether or not you wish to receive information from us. You can chose to receive direct marketing communications from us by ticking the relevant boxes situated on the form on which we collect your information.

We will not contact you for marketing purposes by email, phone or text message unless you have given your prior consent. We will not contact you for marketing purposes by post if you have indicated that you do not wish to be contacted. You have the right to:

- Have inaccurate personal data rectified, or completed if it is incomplete.
- Have personal data erased also known as 'the right to be forgotten'
- Have the right to restrict the processing of their personal data

- Receive personal data they have provided to a controller in a structured, commonly used and machine readable format
- have the right to object to processing based on legitimate interests; the performance of a
 task in the public interest/exercise of official authority (including profiling); direct marketing
 (including profiling); and processing for purposes of scientific/historical research and
 statistics.

We use an appropriate combination of technical and organisational measures to ensure, as far as reasonable possible the confidentiality, integrity and availability of your information at all times. 16 or Under

- We do not use automated decision making and profiling on our website
